“AARON’S ROD”

After the problem of rebellion and the complaints of the people against Moses and Aaron, the LORD told Moses to have each tribe provide a rod with the name of the tribe on it (the tribe of Levi was to have Aaron’s name on it). The LORD then promised that “it shall come to pass, that the man’s rod, whom I shall choose, shall blossom: and I will make to cease from me the murmurings of the children of Israel, whereby they murmur against you (Numbers 17:5).” As we well know, it was Aaron’s rod that budded. Moses presented the rods to the people so they could examine them and observe God’s judgment (Numbers 17:8-9). Numbers 17:8-9 say, “And it came to pass, that on the morrow Moses went into the tabernacle of witness; and, behold, the rod of Aaron for the house of Levi was budded, and brought forth buds, and bloomed blossoms, and yielded almonds. And Moses brought out all the rods from before the LORD unto all the children of Israel: and they looked, and took every man his rod.” Then “the LORD said unto Moses, Bring Aaron’s rod again before the testimony, to be kept for a token against the rebels; and thou shalt quite take away their murmurings from me, that they die not (Numbers 17:10).”

There is a simple way to solve problems in the church today -- find out what God wants and abide by it. God did not, however, initiate this particular event in order to stop a rebellion or an occasion of complaining. Korah’s rebellion and the complaining of the people had already been judged. Aaron’s rod served as testimony for the people who remained, and for future generations, not to question God’s will and God’s judgment.

Today, elders and preachers in many locations face hostility from those who seek the introduction of entertainment-oriented “worship,” women in leadership roles, doctrinal compromise, and denominational practices. When God caused Aaron’s rod to bud, he revealed His will for those people and all who followed afterward under the Old Law. When Jesus came, He revealed God’s will for those people and all of us who have followed (John 12:48). John 12:48 says, “He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day.” All the people had to do in the years that followed was look to Aaron’s rod to know God’s will in regard to the priesthood. All we must do today is look to God’s Word and we will know God’s will about everything.
