## “THE WEeping APOSTLE: PART 2”

There is a disposition on the part of those of us who often resort to close and careful reasoning leading to what to us are irresistible conclusions to expect too much from this mode of communication. Propositions which to us appear unanswerable to our astonishment and keen disappointment leave others unmoved. It is not unusual for people without a knowledge of logical processes to brush all reasoning aside. Seldom, indeed, are men moved to make great decisions by syllogisms alone; and their impact, on the untaught mind, is often negligible. These things are the mechanics of communication; they are difficult for the unlearned in logic to follow; and, to many, they convey a sense of contrived confusion. Those of this category are more likely to be moved by emotional appeals than by plain, unvarnished truth. The denominational world has capitalized on this, and through appeals based on the emotions have been able, in large measure, to keep multitudes of people from learning the truth. Because they have used this means so effectively in the propagation of error there is not a little prejudice against their use, even in support of truth, in the church today. Properly used, they may be made to contribute to the advancement of truth, and they ought to be. There is more room for feeling in our preaching than many of us are willing to allow.

Those who are ignorant of logical thought processes and who are unable to follow a closely-knit argument to its proper conclusion often feel that were they clever enough they might be able to discover a flaw in the argument. There is the vague feeling that if they were shrewd enough they could answer the argument and that their inability to do so is not due to weakness of position but of unfamiliarity with the method. They have the feeling that one is not obligated to believe everything one cannot easily refute. Further, logic divides a subject into its parts, dissects its various aspects, and looks at each separately. The whole, with all of its relations, does not appear before the mind in the process until the conclusion is drawn by which time many have either forgotten the premises or regard them as unimpressive. Cold, critical analysis does not prompt the average person to major decisions.

When the judgment has been convinced the will must still be influenced before the life is changed. This is far from saying that logic has no place in the proclamation of truth. Quite the contrary; propositions must be proved and conclusions not resting on sound premises ought immediately to be rejected; and, there is no valid reason for the repudiation of reasoning in the teaching process as some today do; but it is not a substitute for appeals to the will and was never intended to be. All of us who teach and preach should keep ever in mind that when the judgment is convinced the will must yet be moved before surrender through obedience results.

We will be much more effective if we keep in mind that in addition to **proving** truth (which is of course our **first** duty), we must also prompt to its espousal; and that this may be done in many instances through appeals to incentives embedded in the emotional nature. Paul instructed Timothy to reprove, rebuke, **and exhort** (1 Tim. 4:2), and he himself set the pattern by not only reasoning with men but also by **persuading** them (Acts 19:8).
